# LOVE FOR THE PEOPLE, TORAH FOR THE PEOPLE

First of all, thank you to Yitzzy Weinstein for giving me this opportunity to write. Last week's parsha, Parshas Yisro, the Jews camped around Har Sinai. Chazal tell us K'ish Echad B'Lev Echad- like one man with one heart; so much love and appreciation for each other. Then and only then did Hashem give us the Torah. In the following travels, Rashi explains there were arguments and disagreements. This week's parsha, Parshas Mishpatim speaks about specific laws and damages that are relevant to man and his friend, damages that are intentionally and unintentionally done, which can bring about anger and hate- and require the Beis Din to sttle the case. These laws were also said at Sinai. We can suggest that the Torah split the story of Sinai into two parts- teaching us Jews a vital lesson, that the prerequisite for keeping the Torah is to love one another like one man with one heart. That itself will prevent us from doing damages to each other, and even if damages do occur, God forbid, we will behave and proceed according to what the Torah teaches, and restore the love and appreciation the Jewish people have for one another. May Hashem bless us all to love and appreciate each other and every Jew! Prevent us from hurting or damaging any Jew, and bless us with greeting the holy redeemer, MBD (Moshiach Ben David), Amen V'Amen!
