- 1. Renewal-I am born now. I can choose to live a new life if I want to. Today is literally the first day of the rest of my life.
- 2. Hashem loves me and wants me with all of my problems-"כולכם"-all of me. He created me for a major purpose.
- 3. I deep down love everyone and deep down respect everyone. When I see negative in someone else, it is a sign from Hashem that I need to fix that very thing within myself. I thank You, Hashem, for showing me what I need to work on and I deep down truly love that person and all of Klal Yisroel.
