In basketball the coach makes a strategized game plan and the players try to execute the plan to their best abilities. Let's say the plan isn't working and the other team (yetzer hara) is winning so you call a time out. You go back to your coach (rebbi/therapist/parent etc) and you change the game plan. You ask for an assist from a teammate and you retry. Just like basketball, consistency is key. The more you work on your skills and practice the strategy, the better you play and bigger chance you have of winning. So my bracha to everyone is listen to your coach (rebbeim), anyone that you trust and listen to what they have to say, put it into action and through that we will be able to be the best us we can be! love you all Good Shabbos!
